**The list above represents a portion of all families served at a Ronald McDonald House in Alberta in 2025.** Communities represented change annually in how many families access the services of Ronald McDonald House Alberta. Annually the organization serves families from **over 300 communities**. This representation does not include the hundreds of families who benefitted from the Day Pass program or the Comfort Cart. Supporting access to pediatric healthcare is essential to families needing to travel.

In May 2025 we opened the doors to an expanded Ronald McDonald House in Calgary after a temporary closure. The facility changed from 27 family suites to **91 suites**. Through our graduated opening in 2025 we have been able to serve more families annually than ever before and our numbers will continue to grow in 2026
